World Apostolate of Fatima Presentations

Commendations for the WAF Fatima presentation (most recent first)

Fr John Seddon, OSB, Chilworth Abbey, near Guildford

We asked Donal Foley to organise a day of prayer and instruction when he stayed with us as a guest. After initial doubts about a January date, the weather was clement and we attracted around 60 people from a number of surrounding parishes. The day achieved a good balance between prayer and devotion, and instruction. Effective use was made of “PowerPoint” technology, so that the talks by Donal and Timothy Tindal-Robertson, were constantly being reinforced in people's minds both visually and aurally.

The fundamental aim, was to convince those who came, that the message of Fatima is even more relevant today than it has ever been and that, following Our Lady's instructions is still essential for the peace of the world and the extension of the Christian faith. From the feedback given by the participants at the end of the day, this aim was achieved. I would recommend both speakers warmly for future Fatima Day parish and school presentations.

In his World Apostolate of Fatima presentation that he gave at St Patrick's Church in November 2011, Donal Foley gave a wonderfully clear account of the apparitions of Our Lady to the three little seers, Lucia, Francisco and Jacinta at Fatima in 1917.

The first video was a comprehensive treatment of the visions with illustrations to heighten the content and the sequence of events, some of which I had forgotten, and then Donal reiterated the message with a Power Point slide presentation. The overall effect led up to his very sensible conclusion that the Faithful needed to give heed to Our Lady's request that we should do the First Five Saturdays.

This is the part that we play in bringing about the triumph of Mary's Immaculate Heart and the reign of Peace and which so to speak brings to a conclusion the responses to the request which Our Lady asked of the Church, which included praying the Rosary, doing penance for sinners, and the consecration of Russia to the Immaculate Heart by the Pope, which Lucia said was done by Blessed John Paul II in 1984.

One sincerely hopes that through the World Apostolate of Fatima, Donal Foley will be able to spread this message far and wide throughout the Church in these lands.
