

WAF England and Wales Newsletter, First Saturdays, October 2017

Dear Friends,

This is the World Apostolate of Fatima (WAF) England and Wales newsletter for October 2017.

The Visitations of the Statue and Relics continued during September at Leeds Cathedral and then at Middlesbrough diocese between the 9th and 15th; following that, they went to Hexham and Newcastle Cathedral from 16-17th, before visiting St Joseph's parish in Sunderland from 17-18th September.

After that, the Statue and Relics were at Norwich Cathedral from 23-24th of the month, follwed by a Visitation to the Shrine of Our Lady at Walsingham from the 25-27th. Finally there was be a Visitation to Northampton diocese over the weekend, 30th September to 1st October.

As has been the case previously, these Visitations went very well, and there was a lovely response from congregations to the Statue and Relics visiting their church or cathedral.

Centenary programme of WAF Visitations in October:

The final Centenary year Visitations take place this month, with a Visitation to Liverpool Cathedral from 6-7th October, followed by a brief visit to St Alban's church in Macclesfield in the late afternoon on Saturday 7th October. This will

be followed, on Sunday 8th October, by a visit to the Carmelite Shrine, at Aylesford.

The final Visitation will be to the Diocese of Brentwood on the weekend of the 14-15th October, at the church of Our Lady of Fatima in Harlow.

At each of these Visitations the faithful will be able to venerate the relics of Saints Jacinta and Francisco, and participate in devotions to Our Lady.

Saturday 7th October, is the first Saturday of the month, so you may want to keep the Fatima Five First Saturdays devotion in your local parish.

There will be First Saturday devotions at St Barnabas Cathedral in Nottingham after 10 am Mass.

As noted above, Josie Fearnley, has organised a 'A Day of Renewal of Our Lady of Fatima' in her parish, St Alban's in Macclesfield, which will culminate in a Visit of the Statue and Relics in the late afternoon.

She says, "We want to make it a very special day in honour of Our Lady, Our Mother Mary. Please do come along and bring your family and friends. This is the last month of Our Lady's Apparitions in Fatima, of this Centenary year."

There are also First Saturday devotions at Hilton House near Lichfield beginning with 10 am with prayers of Reparation, followed by Mass at 10:15, and then Fatima devotions and conffessions, as well as a holy hour. Please email Nichola at: nichola313@btinternet.com for more details.

At the church in Glastonbury, Confessions are at 9 am, with Rosary and Meditations at 9.20 am and Mass at 10 am.

At St. Mary's Catholic church in Louth, Lincolnshire, there are First Saturday devotions every first Saturday of the year, starting with the Creed at 10am followed by the Joyful Mysteries of the Rosary, followed by the Act of Consecration to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. Mass of Our Lady follows immediately at 10.30am. Confessions from 11.00 to 11.30 am.

Five First Saturdays Devotion at Sacred Heart Roman Catholic Church,

Morriston, Swansea are as follows: First Saturday of the month, from May to October,
Sacred Heart parish First Saturday requests of Our Lady at Fatima.

10.15 am Holy Rosary,10.30am Holy Mass,11am Eucharistic Adoration, plus confessions, allowing for a 15 minute meditation on the Rosary, concluding with an Act of Consecration and reparation to the Immaculate Heart of Mary, and Benediction at 12 noon
