### Message from WAF International President

Dear Friends,

Prof. Américo Pablo López-Ortiz, the International President of the World Apostolate of Fatima has sent out a message to the members of the World Apostolate worldwide concerning the Global Pandemic. You can read the entire message here, but the following is a summary of some of his remarks:

He speaks of this being a worldwide crisis, one causing thousands of deaths and a strict lockdown in many countries, including the suspension of public liturgies and closing of churches, and says this is a tremendous burden for humanity.

He then points out that Saints Francisco and Jacinta Marto, the two child saints of Fatima, died from the terrible pandemic caused by another virus, the so-called "Spanish influenza". Jacinta endured many complications and much pain as part of her vocation to become a reparatory victim. The sickness was also transmitted by the soldiers returning from the war to their families. Many millions of people from around the world died from it.

He also speaks of praying to Francisco and Jacinta, that they will bring comfort and strength to our families today, and can through prayer assist our medical doctors and sanitary personnel in their great sacrifices to combat this dangerous virus - and also, we hope, illuminate the minds of scientists so they can discover a cure and a vaccine to eradicate this calamity.

# Prof Americo also spoke of the Consecration carried out on 25 March in Fatima.

The Ecclesiastical Advisor of WAF International, Antonio Cardinal Marto, Bishop of Leiria-Fatima, consecrated Portugal and Spain, the Iberian Peninsula, to the Immaculate Heart of Mary, on the 25th of March, 2020, on the Anniversary of the Collegial Consecration performed to the Immaculate Heart of Mary by Pope St. John Paul II in 1984. This was the consecration that produced "the Miracle of the Century", the collapse of the Soviet Union and the Communist countries in Eastern Europe. devotion was intended to be practiced by the whole family. But it was not done by families. It was done by individuals. Now it is the time to start a family practice!

We are not allowed to have it publicly in our parish churches because of the pandemic. From these circumstances we can learn the following lessons:

- The first Church is the "domestic Church" and the Holy Family represents it:
- The Good Lord is calling us to the development of our interiority, "the God that dwells in our hearts", the school of holiness taught to us by Our Lady of Fatima through the interior life developed by the child shepherds "who saw God through the eyes of Mother Mary", participating in her beatific vision of the Most Holy Trinity;
- This also gives us the opportunity to first evangelize our own family in these days of enforced sharing of our time!

During the First Saturdays that we are kept in our family homes, we will fulfil the Great Promise of the Immaculate Heart of Mary in the following way:

- Confessing our sins spiritually to Jesus, with deep repentance and perfect contrition, as Pope Francis taught, when there is no sacramental Confession available, promising to receive sacramental Confession as soon as possible;
- Making a spiritual Communion with the intention of making reparation to the Immaculate Heart of Mary;
- Praying the Rosary and meditating on its mysteries;
- Sharing in the company of Our Mother Mary's solitude and keeping her company for 15 minutes of meditation, in addition to the reflection of the mysteries on the Rosary;
- Offering this devotion as a means of uniting our family in God's love, grace and mercy, and so liberating us from "the spirit of the world".
